Community engagement report (e.g., number and type of events, attendance, future plans)	<p><u>May 2013 Programming</u></p> <p>Programming: 75 Arlington High School’s 7th grade scholars attended an all-day field trip on May 15th, 2013 to the Defending WNBA National Champions “Choices for Champions” educational program at Bankers Life Fieldhouse. The purpose of the field trip is to bring awareness around “Blocking out Bullying” and the importance of eating healthy. Scholars were introduced to some of Indiana’s Finest Role Models with the Indiana Fever and be afforded the opportunity to view the first home game of the Indiana Fever for the 2013 season. Programming: 46 members of the freshman class traveled to Bloomington, Indiana for a field trip to Indiana University. They arrived on campus and attended an information session where scholars were informed about college acceptance criteria and the various majors that are offered by Indiana University. The presenter emphasized three specific areas that the admission's staff pay close attention to:

1. Upward Trends of GPA growth (Emphasis on Junior year)
2. Writing Skills (Personal Essay)
3. Respectable ACT/SAT scores (Above Average)

Our scholars experienced a campus tour which provided them exposure to the layout and rich history of the university. We concluded our field trip by enjoying lunch in the Indiana Memorial Union cafeteria. Immediately following lunch, they returned back to Arlington in the mini-auditorium to reflect upon the experience.

Programming: On May 31st, Arlington High School graduated 10 seniors with the 50th Commencement ceremony. All 10 graduated with Core 40 Diploma.

Programming: On June 7th, Arlington High School promoted 65 eighth graders in a Promotion ceremony in the Auditorium. All parents and guardians were invited and joined us in the celebration.

Programming: On June 22nd, Arlington hosted the 1st Andre Stennette-Harrod Charity 3 on 3 Basketball tournament. There were 8 teams mostly made up of current and former Tindley scholars, an Arlington team as well as local teams from Indianapolis. It was a success and was executed without incident. City Council-At-Large Leroy Robinson & Chief Richard Hite were on-hand to witness the tournament.

Programming: 40 members of the class of 1963 toured Arlington as a part of their 50th high school reunion celebration on Saturday, June 29th. This is the 1st graduating class of Arlington High School and they were accompanied by teachers who were teaching in 1963 as well.
