Project CyberSafe

What is Project CyberSafe?

A one hour presentation about cyberbullying and how to stay safe online. Three unique versions of the presentation are available for students and parents.

- **Students** learn what cyberbullying is and the legal and emotional consequences of their actions. They are also taught how to protect themselves and their personal information online.
- **Parents** and concerned adults learn how to prevent and address online



bullying behavior among youth as well as tips to better monitor a youth's "media diet."

Who presents Project CyberSafe?

Deputy Prosecutors from the Marion County Prosecutor's Office.

Target Audience

- Elementary to 13-year-olds
- Teen: 14 - 18-year-olds
- Parents and concerned adults

Choices Not Chances

What is Choices Not Chances?

An interactive, online decision tree that teaches youth the consequences of good and bad choices.

Students navigate through scenarios involving gangs, bullying, and dating violence, highlighting the positive and negative outcomes of their choices in each situation.



Who presents Choices Not Chances?

Representatives from the Marion County Prosecutor's Office can present the activity to a group, or educators and parents can access the presentation and scripts online directly to walk through with classes or their family.

Target Audience

10 to 18-year-olds

Educating Kids about Gun Violence (EKG)

What is EKG?

A one hour gun violence education and prevention program that works to stop gun violence among youth.

Students interact through a video presentation by answering questions related to how they would handle certain scenarios, or what the best choice would be.

Who presents EKG?

A representative from the Marion County Prosecutor's Office and a medical professional from Eskenazi Health.

Target Audience

10 to 18-year-olds

Teen Dating Violence

What is Teen Dating Violence Presentation?

This one hour presentation for schools and youth serving organizations. Its aim is to teach teens how to recognize the potential signs of dating violence.

Who presents Teen Dating Violence?

Deputy Prosecutors from the Marion County Prosecutor's Office.
